Notes
The purpose of this bill is to allow out-of-state residents to ride a motorcycle without a helmet if they are allowed to do so in their state of residence.
Relating to prohibiting discrimination based on an individual's mental or physical disability in access to organ transplantation; and providing enforcement mechanisms.
Persons aged 21 years and older may operate or be a passenger on a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle without a helmet if they have held a license valid for the operation of a motorcycle for a minimum of two years.

Adding a Dashboard Card option.
The purpose of this bill is to limit the amount that an insured person is required to pay for his or her insulin prescription to \$100 per 30-day supply.
The purpose of this bill is to ensure coverage for residents with preexisting conditions and to ensure that their costs are the same as the general population.

The purpose of this bill is to prohibit public entities, including state, county and municipal buildings and facilities, places of public accommodation and commercial facilities, from charging a fee for parking in an accessible parking space bearing the international symbol of access.

The purpose of this bill is to prohibit health insurers from denying coverage for accident or sickness as a result of a preexisting condition in the requirement and prohibitions of the Affordable Care Act are no longer enforceable or no longer preempt state law.

The purpose of this bill is to provide reforms to the state's Medicaid procedures by tightening hospital presumptive eligibility; mitigating the damage from federal Maintenance-of-Effort (MOE) handcuffs; and enhancing Medicaid program integrity.

(1) Requires renewal stickers have color backgrounds correlated to and identifying the year of expiration; (2) requires issuing healthcare providers to specify a specific time period for issuing temporary cards, (3) allows temporary placards to be renewed; and (4) requires applicants to have a second vehicle registered in their name before receiving an additional placard.
